A couple of obvious errors and omissions have been corrected without comment.

Musica ficta

Leading-note cadences are determined from a linear perspective, and as such, are easily discernible from a single part; signed by return from above immediately before the final syllable of a musical and / or textual phrase.

No attempt has been made to correct false fifths and harmonic and melodic tritones, an integral part of the composer's style and the Northern European dialect of the Franco-Flemish School during the first half of the Sixteenth century.

The *Bassus* E-flat in bar 132, almost certainly added by Phalèse or his scribe, is unlikely to have been part of Clemens non Papa's original conception, and has been suppressed. The sequence is typical of the period and works best unaltered. Despite present-day conceptions of what was melodically acceptable at the time, sixteenth-century singers were sometimes expected to negotiate direct tritones. The E-natural is confirmed by the *Tenor*.

The raising of final thirds was not yet expected of performers, even though the notational practice already seems to have taken root in Northern Italy. From exponents of the Franco-Flemish School in the Netherlands, we should expect to see such notes clearly signed.

Translation:

Learned men come from the East seeking Jerusalem and saying, "Where is he that was born king of the Jews, whose star we have seen? For we have come with gifts to worship the Lord."
